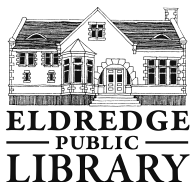
Turnbull, Sarah

Adler, Elizabeth

*The Last Time I Saw Paris*

When her husband backs out of their second honeymoon in Paris, forty something Lara asks a 32 year old construction worker to accompany her and embarks on a madcap, romantic adventure.

*The Elegance of the Hedgehog*

The lives of 54 year old concierge Rene Michel and extremely bright suicidal 12 year old Paloma Josse are transformed by the arrival of a new tenant, Ozu.

Berry, Steve

*The Templar Legacy*

A former secret agent teams up with a U.S. Justice Dept prosecutor to follow a trail of danger, intrigue, and treachery across Europe to find the secrets to the Knights Templar.

Bradford, Barbara Taylor

*Three Weeks in Paris*

Years after a falling out ends their friendship, four friends confront unfinished business during a class reunion.

Chevalier, Tracy

*The Lady and the Unicorn*

Interweaves historical fact with fiction to explore the mystery behind the creation of the 15th century Lady and the Unicorn tapestries.

A classic read of the many action filled adventures of three swordsmen.

Harris, Joanne  
*Chocolate*  
A single mother moves to a tiny French town, opens a chocolate shop and inadvertently starts a war with the local priest.

Harris, Joanne  
*Five Quarters of the Orange*  
A dark historical fiction recounting the German occupation of France during WWII.

Houghteling, Sara  
*Pictures at an Exhibition*  
In the wake of WWII, Max Berenzon, son of an art dealer, wanders Paris in an effort to recover his family's lost masterpieces, looted by the Nazi, and uncovering in the process an old family secret.

Loomis, Susan Herrmann  
*On Rue Tatin: Living and Cooking in a French Town*  
This is a wonderful memoir of a woman who left the U.S. to attend a cooking school in France, then returns to France years later with her family.

Lynch, Sarah-Kate  
*House of Daughters*  
Expecting to inherit the family's vineyard in the French province of Champagne after her father's death, Clementine discovers to her dismay that she must share the inheritance with her two half-sisters.

Mayle, Peter  
*French Lessons: Adventures with Knife, Fork and Corkscrew*  
Mayle, is the go-to author for those who love France or long to visit. This book is a culinary tour of France.

Mayle, Peter  
*Hotel Pastis: A Novel of Provence*  
A fictional book about tycoon Simon Shaw who purchases a small hotel in the south of France. Interesting and funny story, with intrigue, crime and romance all thrown in.

*Labyrinth*
